MOCA record says "Maine PVT, Harris' Regt, Pike's Regt, Rev War". Capt Hugh Mason genealogy p205 says "Ebenezer Mason appears as one of the early settlers of Littleborough (renamed Leeds in 1801), and as being actively engaged in throwing off the "British Yoke".

MOCA cemetery recordds show no James or Mercy Packard in Piscataquis Co or Cambridge. MOCA Parkman Village Cem does list Lydia wife of James Packard d 18 Oct 1841 age 28y 3m. Perhaps the town clerk mixed up the name and year. 1850 Parkman census says Stephen & Mahitable are both 34, and all ch Christopher through Charles are still living. 1860 Parkman census also has Stephen & Mehitable both age 44, and lists all the children. 1870 Parkman has them both age 55, all the ch still in the house except Calvin. 1880 Parkman has her wd living alone age 64; the others not found in Pisc Co. Mehitable, Stephen, son Calvin, and mother Mercy are all buried in Parkman Village Cem behind the church, on the marble Gilbert Monument. On the same side as Mercy Mason is Stephen Gilbert's parents, Bailey Gilbert d June 1 1864 age 71 & wife Sarah d June 13 1879 age 82. Bailey was a son of Samuel Gilbert.

Martha Leavitt, the daughter of Ralph's half-brother William Henry Harrison Leavitt, names her son Ralph Clinton Twist in 1886. It sounds to me that there was contact between Joseph Leavitt's two families and that Martha had a fondness for her Uncle Ralph. Ralph named a son Joseph C. Leavitt; that C is also lost to history, but could be Joseph Calvin after his grandfathers Joseph Clinton. I believe the middle names were used to differentiate between the contemporaries. That still begs the question of where the name Ralph Clinton came from in 1828. I have not found any generals or other statesmen, for which Joseph was fond of naming his children. I believe Joseph named his son Joseph D after his distant cousin/uncle Daniel Leavitt b 1748. Ralph and Mary were married by Comfort Taylor, Minister of the Gospel at the Cambridge Baptist Church, aka Cambridge Union Meeting Hall. Ralph is buried in Mt Pleasant Cemetery in Cambridge ME halfway up the hill; empty spots on both sides of him. The lot was purchased by his son Joseph C Leavitt. Son Willy H is buried in the Cambridge Village Cemetery, now known as the Cambridge Memorial Garden Cemetery.

Ralph died without an estate and separated from his wife, and working in Cornville, 3 towns SW of Cambridge. D/C says he was single with little info about him. However in 1901, 7 years after his death, a note turned up owing him money, which showed up in Somerset County Probate Court as File 1380, and solved a long mystery as to where Ralph's wife and children other than Joseph disappeared. It confirms Ralph's death date and that he last dwelt in Cornville. The record details the relationships as Mary A Leavitt widow of Salem, Mass, son Joseph C administrator of Waterville, and sons Fred M and Hamlin B both of Salem MA. The 1901 court filing explains "The occasion for this [late filing] is the recent discovery of a witnessed note dated November 10, 1884, in favor of the intestate for \$133, on which no payments have been made. Joseph is always referred to as simply Joseph C, the middle name lost to history. The C could stand for Clifford or Calvin or Clinton, maybe it was just plain C so that it could stand for any of them; see notes under his father. None of the names is carried on in subsequent generations. I believe his full name is most likely Joseph Calvin, named after both of his parents' fathers. The entire family of Joseph, Ellura, Sina, Chester, Ulrich, Edith and husband William are all buried in the family plot at Pine Grove Cemetery in Waterville, Lot 548, on Crescent Ave. Have photos of stones, and photos of people except Chester and Ulrich. November 2008, Pine Grove Cemetery told us their records state that Chester was reinterred in 1903 from Cambridge Maine. They also said that Ulrich Leavitt is buried there in "plot #4", though without any marker. No living family members had known anything about it. Joseph C Leavitt is also registered as the person who bought the lot in Mt Pleasant Cemetery in Cambridge, where his father Ralph is buried, and likely where his son Chester was first buried.

Joseph was reportedly a deeply religious man and a lay minister, a landscape gardener, and an insurance agent. He rented a home at 5 Pleasant St in Waterville. Stinneford cousin Thelma Barrows in 1985 writes "I used to know Aunt Ellura and Uncle Joe real well. I used to live in Waterville until I was 9 years old. Uncle Joe used to come over and say our prayers with us at night. He was a wonderful man but religious." He died on a Wednesday. Death certificate says he committed "suicide by drowning", jumping off a bridge in Auburn. He was reportedly in great pain from some illness.

I have a church "Notice Of Transfer. Mr. Joseph C Leavitt. At your request I have this day sent a Certificate of Transfer of your membership to the Hammond Street Methodist Episcopal Church in Lewiston, Maine. When said Certificate is acknowledged and your name is recorded in the records of said Church, your membership in this Church will cease. [signed] E. A. Pollard Jones, Pastor. 17 January 1922. A handwritten note on the other side says: "We are sorry to have you leave us but feel that you are doing the proper thing to attach yourself to some nearer church. Sincerely, EAPJ." E A Pollard Jones was pastor at the Waterville Pleasant Street United Methodist Church 1921-1927. Not sure if he moved there by himself or with his family.

Waterville Pleasant Street United Methodist Church, 5/06, report their records say Joseph Leavitt joined their church 1 April 1894, transferring from the Brighton First Baptist Church [all denominations used the same church building there]. Wife Ellura M joined 28 Oct 1894 from "probation" [means she had been coming a while and finally joined]. On 22 Feb 1927 she was removed by "RWC"; they don't know what that means. Daughter Sina also joined 28 Oct 1894 from probation, and died 17 Dec 1910.

Hamlin B. was bp 8 Mar 1886 at Waterville Pleasant Street United Methodist Church. Also mentioned in church records is Ella C and Fred M. Every notation is simply Hamlin B. The only B name in the family is his mother's grandfather Benjamin Morgridge who died 11 years earlier, so that is likely the name.

Hamlin sued for divorce against his first wife, Nellie [2:59]. She deserted him 15 August 1891 and not heard from since. Divorce granted in Kennebec Superior Court 12 April 1895. No children. Div gave m date and place but not Nellie's last name. Lewiston m/c gives her name, both residents of Lewiston, his name still just Hamlin B, married by John F Putman, JP, no parents or other info given. Nobody named Hitchie is in Ancestry's census index.

Evidently Hamlin also married Ida May Roach while he was already married. Penobscot County Probate Files have F Marion Simpson of Carmel appointed guardian 15 Feb 1888 of Ida May Roach, age 16, minor child of Ella N Roach late of Carmel. Father still living, but divorce had given custody to the mother [divorced Apr 1878, Pen 52/160 docket 836]. On 19 Apr 1890, F Marion Simpson of Carmel resigns as guardian of Ida May Roach of Bangor because he is the administrator of estate of Phebe M Soule late of Carmel in which the said Ida May Roach is interested as an heir to said estate. On May 6, 1891, F Marion Simpson files a final account as Guardian of Ida May LEAVITT, formerly of Bangor but now of Waterville. Ida May Leavitt received the last \$100 in the account "Ida May Roach, now Ida May Leavitt, wife of Hamlin B Leavitt". No marriage, divorce, or death record found. Maine marriages does have Ida M Roach 23 b Bangor md Edwin S Carville 32 b Lewiston, both of L, on 8 Sep 1894 in Lewiston. Her 1st m, he wid. She a dressmaker, he a stove polisher. Her parents are listed as [blank] farmer of/b Bangor & Nellie Small of/b Bangor. His parents are Ezra R Carville of/b L & Dorcas Jordan b Webster. [Perhaps Hamlin make-believe married her so she could get her final check? or maybe there is a bigamy annulment in court records?]

Ella Maxwell was the daughter of Enos A Maxwell b Alfred and Alice Tracy b WI. Ella E Leavitt [Maxwell] sued Hamlin B Leavitt for divorce for desertion; granted 11 Feb 1901 in Androscoggin Co. [Maine Divorces 5:54]. Ella is buried in Evergreen Cem Rt 4, Alfred ME, Lot 70 under a huge maple tree in left section; stone calls her "Ella E Leavitt, dau of E A & Alice Maxwell, 31 Dec 1877 - 8 Dec 1905"; MOCA York Co does not list her parents there.

He m3 (or 4th?) Etta C Dunbar (widow Mrs Springer) 16 May 1903 in Salem MA v536 p605. Hamlin and Etta are both weavers, 32, and of Salem. Married by Frank M Lamb, Minister of the Gospel. Etta was buried 3 Dec 1923 at Greenlawn Cem in Salem, Anenome Path.

D/C v27 p13 #559: Hamlin B Leavitt drowned (Probable accidental drowning) in Salem Harbor near Willows. He resided at 25 Laurel St in Salem, and was divorced and a weaver. Buried Greenlawn Cemetery Salem, but removed 1926 to Harmony Grove Cem, Salem, acc to d/c. Jan 2012 - Harmony Grove has no record of our Leavitts. Greenlawn Cem confirms he is buried there, buried 6 Nov 1919 with no notation of transfer in either direction, Murphy Funeral Home. Lot#1395 on Red Bud Ave was purchased by son Ralph Leavitt.

Larry wrote, "Hamlin jumped into the ocean at the pier at the Salem Willows Park, he could not swim, my grandfather Ralph identified the body. I have the Salem Evening News frontpage story from 1919. His sister lived in Seabrook NH." Salem News death notice - In Salem, Nov 5, drowned, Hamlin B Leavitt, 50 years, a native of Maine, and the son of Mrs Mary (Mogaige) and the late Ralph Leavitt.

The Salem Evening News Thursday Nov 6, 1919 frontpage near top. Headline: Man Downed at Willows was Hamlin B Leavitt. Subheadline: Identified by Son Yesterday; Had lived in Salem for 15 years, working at Naumkeag Mill; Despondent Over Loafing Because of Strike. Text:

The body which washed ashore at Salem Willows yesterday morning was identified late yesterday afternoon as that of Hamlin B Leavitt of 25 Laurel St Salem. The identification was made by a son, Ralph E of the same address.

According to the son, Mr Leavitt had been a resident of Salem for the past 15 years and was employed at the Naumkeag mills before the strike.

The son could give no reason for his father's act, except that he might have been despondent over the closing of the mill. He had been missing from his home since last Sunday night. Mr Leavitt was aboput 50 years of age and leaves a mother, a son Ralph E and a daughter Elonia. He also has a brother Joseph in Waterville, Me.

Hamlin married **Nellie E HITCHIE** 4 Jan 1890 in Lewiston, Androscoggin, ME. Nellie was born in 1870. Hamlin next married **Ida May ROACH**, daughter of **Albert J ROACH** and **Ella N**, between Apr 1890 and May 1891 in Bangor Or Waterville, ME. Ida was born in 1871.

Hamlin next married **Ella E MAXWELL**, daughter of **Enos A MAXWELL** and **Alice TRACY**, 9 May 1895 in Waterville, Kennebec, ME. Ella was born 19 Nov 1878 in Alfred, York, ME and died 8 Dec 1905 in Auburn, Androscoggin, ME.

22. Ulrich Frank LEAVITT was born 10 Mar 1881 in Cambridge, Somerset, ME and died 3 Jan 1944 in Norridgewock, Somerset, ME.

Family pronounces his name "Yule-rich". 1904 M/C: Sadie was the dau of Frank L Young and Laura Wheeler. Descendants have no recollection of ever hearing anything about Ulrich or Daisy's first marriages or those names. I have found no divorce record from first wife and it is known that the mar to Daisy was a common-law marriage. Ulrich's death cert lists no information, only his ID "from social security card 007-16-5381". It does say Ulrich Frank Leavitt age abt 63, died of coronary embolism sudden, and influenza. Bur Jan 6, Henry E Hilton, Norridgewock funeral director. Ulrich's dau Ruth said they never knew when he died, their mother told them he died in the 1930s. Note that children Ruth and Bernard were not albinos, and the other 3 were. In November 2008 we discovered from Pine Grove Cemetery in Waterville that Ulrich is indeed buried in the Leavitt family lot with his parents and sister Edith Robertson, William Robertson often "took care of" extended family needs. There was no marker, but is in "Lot #4" between Ellura and Chester; we added a stone in 2009. Daisy O Gage, daughter of Reuben and Annie Gage in 1900 Fairfield, ME census, born Dec 1888. Daisy E Gage married Elton B Moore in 1906 (ME Marriages), the E is wrong as the Daily Kennebec Journal dated 25 Aug, 1906 carried the wedding announcement, and she was Daisy O in that one. Daisy Leavitt is in SSDI 30 Sept 1888 - 15 Dec 1967 last res Oakland. ME Death Index says died 14 Dec 1967 in Waterville. 1936 Oakland street directory, Daisy, widow of Aldrich, h. 198 Summer (Ruth also living here) [Daisy had also told her children that he was dead, because that's what she wished for. He wasn't very nice sometimes.] 1900 census gives bdate as May 1881 could be a transcription error when the census was copied onto the form that was microfilmed.

WWI Draft Card has name as Ulrich Frank born 10 March 1881, no b-place, gardener living Waterville 1918, age 37. He was medium build and height, blue eyes, black hair. Nearest relative is simply Mrs Ulrich Leavitt at his address, 88 Maine in Waterville. Ruth's b/c says Ulrich was born in Harmony. 1941 Soc Sec application also specifies March 10, 1881, born Wellington.

1930 Sidney census, Middle Rd 168/169: Ulrich F Leavitt 48 landscape gardener, not a veteran md at 20; Daisy O wife 42, md at 17; Earle W 16; Ruth A 11; Bernard C 7; Dorothy O 4 1/12.

Ulrich married **Sadie A YOUNG**, daughter of **Frank L YOUNG** and **Laura WHEELER**, 28 Sep 1904 in Etna, Penobscot, ME. Sadie was born in 1881 in Newburgh, Penobscot, ME.

Ulrich had a relationship with **Daisy Olive GAGE**, daughter of **Reuben T GAGE** and **Anna Lodema DECKER**, about 1911. No evidence this couple married. Daisy was born 30 Sep 1888 in Oakland, Kennebec, ME and died 14 Dec 1967 in Waterville, Kennebec, ME.

Daisy O Leavitt is bur in Lakeview Cem in Oakland 1888-1967 with son Earl W Leavitt 1914-1955. M/C: In 1906 her first husband Elton B Moore was of Boston and a salesman, son of James B Moore b No Conway NH & Eleanor Nason dec b Bristol MA. Married by Charles P Cleaves. Gives her parents as Reuben Gage & Annie Decker. Unable to find any record of Elton, incl divorce or death.

Newspaper clippings from the scrapbook of Anna Decker Gage, from descendant Valton Wood:

Oakland - Mrs. Daisy Olive Leavitt, 79, died Thursday night at a Waterville nursing home after a long illness. She was born here on September 30, 1888, the daughter of Reuben and Anna Decker Gage.

They lived in the same location in 1935, per labelled family photos. The PO says the post-911 address is now 30 E Leavitt St. Photo is on google maps and says it is a large house 1572 sq ft 8 rooms, 3 beds built in 1890, with a garage/barn, lot size .54 acre.

Edith & William are buried in the family plot with her parents at Pine Grove Cemetery Lot 548, Waterville. The April 1 1926 Kennebec Journal p2 has the Skowhegan local news, with an article headlined "Easter Concert at Federated Church". Mrs Edith Robertson played "Faith", and Jeannette Robertson was one of the "Lilies of the Field". Genetic tree: 5'0"; wt 100; brown hair. COD septicaemia, possibly acutely infected gall bladder attack. Cousin Carole Guentert adds, On Edith, I heard via Mom that she died of septicemia after her gall bladder surgery as her older retired former employer Dr E. P. Fish, did the surgery as a favor and left "the proverbial sponge" in the surgical site, causing the massive infection. He realized he was too old to be performing surgery, but she wouldn't have anyone else do it. Daughter Marguerite was at her hospital bedside when she passed.

Carole also adds (p84 of her book Hansons of York Maine), "I found that my maternal grandmother, Edith Leavitt Robertson, kept a Shakespeare birthday book with both joyous and sad entries. She made shorthand entries in her memory book on Jan 11 and 18, 1914 that read "Will spoke to me but I decided it was best to wait a month but I only waited a week" and "Will asked me to be his wife. I would not have the slightest idea that he cared for me. I feel sure that he does love me." On Jan 25, 1914, Edith entered "I had my ring. It was put on with a kiss. I think it's a beauty. I do love him." She never entered their wedding date, Nov 11, 1914 in this book."

Edith married **William Lewis ROBERTSON**, son of **William ROBERTSON** and **Alice Florilla SAFFORD**, 11 Nov 1914 in Waterville, Kennebec, ME. William was born 27 Jun 1885 in West Upton, Worcester, MA and died 10 Oct 1947 in Gardiner, Kennebec, ME.

William's birth is reported as 27 June 1886 in later years, but the original birth record is in 1885 Upton birth records. The Grand Lodge of Freemasons can be reached via grandlodge@mainemasons.org and their website has a growing selection of records. Chuck Ridlon of Maine Masons (& NALF member) emailed Roland: "Their website has his initial card from Waterville Lodge 33, he took his 1st degree May 25, 1914; his 2nd degree June 8, 1914; and his 3rd degree, June 15th, 1914. Usually they have to wait 2 weeks between degrees, so this tells me maybe he was leaving for the service so they only left 1 week between his 2nd & 3rd degree."

WWI Draft registration res 62 Burleigh in Waterville, b Upton MA, Civil Engineer for Central Maine Power in Waterville, has wife and child, was a Seargent in Canadian Infantry; medium height and build, blue eyes, dark red hair. Family: 5'11", balding. Carole adds, strawberry blonde to red brown hair.

William graduated from the University of New Brunswick. Birth recorded in Upton VR v360 p386, year 1885 confirmed. Birth record has parents as William Robertson b ME & Alice F Roberts b Dexter ME (sic; she probably said her married name Robertson, then changed it, but the clerk had already started writing it. Alice Florilla Safford WAS b Dexter.). William m2 Helen Elwell (Mrs Cousens) in Gardiner ME 15 June 1940. She m3) Howard Kelley (10 Jan 1891 - April 1983 Warwick RI). Helen and Howard would come to East Rochester to visit the Rhoades family occasionally.

William Lewis Robertson's d/c says he resided at 3 Cobbossee Ave; his wife Helen Cousens was 49; he was b West Upton Mass, and he was District Supt CMP Co. His father was a sea captain b NB and mother Alice Safford b NB [sic]. He died of Pulmonary thrombosis, and prostate cancer. His prostate cancer metasticized to his ribs (which broke when he tried to get out of the car) and spine.

Memories from dau Muriel: How did he meet Helen and where did the big house on the hill (3 Cobbosee Ave) come from? Helen might have been one of the housekeepers. They lived on Central St/Water St in Gardiner, house belonged to Helen, it was a Cousens' house. She worked in a factory office on Water St. Helen's mother was nice, they called her Nana. Muriel and Martha mowed the big steep lawn by hand. William remodeled the house. It burned ca 2010 and was

rebuilt.

Carole Hanson Guentert writes in her book Hansons of York Maine, p84-92: "Will introduced an unpopular stepmother into the Robertson girls' lives when he remarried a few years later. I remember Grandfather Robertson as a tall friendly man (Mom's childhood friend Edith Sanborn described him as "impressive"), who brought 3-foot tall dolls to Peggy and me for Christmas and on our birthdays. He was married to Helen Cousens by that time, and I spent time at their house on the hill in Gardiner Maine (Cobbossee Stream) in the summertime, though my mother never liked her step-mother, and we weren't allowed to either. My mother could really hold a grudge about that, but it may have been well-deserved.

Mom would tell of the huge strawberry shortcakes that her Dad would serve up in soup bowls, because he didn't want his girls to suffer deprivation like he did when he was a boy. When his father remarried, his step-mother cut him off from any financial help for college, so he got a loan from his employer, Ganong's Candy factory in St Stephen NB. Some letters from William are also reproduced in the book.

From MAINE BIOGRAPHIES, republished 2002 in two volumes, was originally published as v3 of Maine Resources, Attractions, and it's People, by Harrie B Coe 1928, v1 p379:

William Lewis Robertson, civil engineer and public utility executive of Skowhegan Maine, was born in West Upton Massachusetts, June 27, 1886, the son of William and Alice Safford Robertson. His father was born in New Brunswick Canada but his mother, died in 1891, was born in Dexter Maine.

Educated in the public schools of New Brunswick Canada, and in the University of New Brunswick, and having qualified as a civil engineer, William Lewis Robertson spent 13 years in municipal employment in the construction of highways, and then specialized in hydro-electric engineering, while continuing his work in general engineering. He was associated with Green and Wilson, civil engineers of Waterville Maine in 1903, later with the Canada and Gulf Terminal Railroad Company, and then with the New Brunswick Hydro-electric Company. On November 2, 1915, he became identified with the engineering department of the Central Maine Power Company, and was assistant superintendent of the Bath district in 1919, where he served until September 1923, when he was promoted to be superintendent of the Skowhegan district.

He is a 32nd degree Free and Accepted Mason; and of all affiliated bodies, and is Past Commander of Dunlap Commandery, Knights Templar, of Bath Maine, and is also a member of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows, and of the Rotary Club of Skowhegan.

William L Robertson married Edith M Leavitt, daughter of Joseph C and Ellura Stinneford Leavitt, at Waterville Maine, November 11, 1914. Her parents were both born in Cambridge Maine. Their children: 1. Marguerite, born October 30, 1916, at Waterville Maine. 2. Jeanette, on October 8, 1918, at Bath Maine.

William L Robertson, Gardiner CMP Company Superintendent Dies

Gardiner - William L Robertson died early Friday morning at the Gardiner General Hospital where he had been a patient for the past eight weeks. He had been in failing health for the past four months. He was born June 27, 1886, in West Upton Massachusetts, the son of William and Alice Safford Robertson.

He is survived by his wife, Helen Cousens Robertson; four daughters, Mrs. James Hanson of York Village; Jeannette Robertson, R.N. of Nashua New Hampshire; Muriel and Martha Robertson of Gardiner; one stepdaughter Mrs. Richard Dyer of Newport Rhode Island; one sister, Mrs. John McBride of St. Stephens New Brunswick; three grandchildren and nieces.

He had been employed at their offices in Bath, Waterville and Skowhegan and for the past 11 years was district superintendent at the Gardiner office. He was a member of Waterville Lodge, No. 33, F and A.M.; Taconnet Chapter, No. 52, R.A.M. of Waterville; Council of Royal And Select Masons of Skowhegan; Dunlap Commandery of Bath; Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite Valley of Augusta; Maine Consistory S.P.R.S. 32nd degree, Valley of Portland. He was a member of DeBouillon Conclave No. 2, Knights of Red Cross of Constantine, Gardiner; past commander of Dunlap Commandery of Bath; past sovereign of Augusta Council Princes of Jerusalem.

He was past president of the Gardiner and Skowhegan Rotary clubs; treasurer of the Maine State Fair Association; race Commissioner for Windsor Fair and had been connected with Windsor Fair for many years. He was a member of the official board of The Highland Avenue Methodist Church and president of the Brotherhood of the church. She died the summer of 1955 and was sick for a period of time before that. She was not wealthy enough to afford her medication. Sorry, but this is all I have..."

Ron Ballard died before Elonia. Ron was at a factory or something 2 miles from home when he died suddenly from a heart attack. He was job searching.

We do not know what hospital Elonia died in. She was in an oxygen tent. Ron had no children. We have no other info no photos....

Seabrook Library found the exact death date/place for me in their 1955 Town report, at the Derry Hospital. Hilda Leavitt Thompson says Ron died before Elonia in the Hampton Beach area, but he is not in NH Deaths thru 1947. Also no Marr rec in NH thru 1947, so likely md in MA.

Elonia married **George Agustus PAYNE**, son of **Ulysses S PAYNE** and **Angelina A BUXTON**, 27 Nov 1919 in Salem, Essex, MA. George was born 17 Nov 1898 in Salem, Essex, MA and died 10 Sep 1951.

George and his parents are buried in Harmony Grove Cem in Salem, along with son Aubrey and wife. (Ulysses d 15 Aug 1929; Angelina d 22 Dec 1941). George remarried.

George's father's sister was Fanny Payne who married Frederick Peabody. There is a very extensive Peabody family tree on Ancestry.com that links to Fanny Payne.
